The Indonesia government and world wild fund (WWF) have announced a bold commitment to protect the remaining forest and critical ecosystem of Sumatra.

WWF said the historic agreement represented the first-ever island- wide commitment to protect Sumatra's stunning biodiversity.

The commitment was announced Thursday at the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), world Conversation Congress in Barcelona and was endorsed by the governors of Sumatra's 10 provinces- the world's sixth-largest island- and also by four ministers.

Sumatra is the only place in the world where tigers, elephants, orangutans and rhinos co-exist.

The agreement commits all the governors in Sumatra, along with the Indonesia ministries of forestry, environment, home affairs and public works, to restore critical ecosystems in Sumatra and protect areas whit high conservation values.

WWF, Conservation International, Fauna and Flora International, Wildlife Conservation Society and other conservation groups working in Sumatra have agreed to help implement the political commitment to protect what remains of the island is species-rich forests and critical areas. The island has lost 48 percent of its natural forest cover since 1985.

More than 13 percent of Sumatra's remaining forests are peat forests, which sit a top the deepest peat soil in the world; clearing peat forests is a major source of carbon emissions that cause climate change

Jakarta's rubbish nightmare

With 13.2 million people, Jakarta is now the world's tenth largest city. Where does all the rubbish go? Jakarta's garbage is a stinking time-bomb waiting to explode.

Jakarta produces as much as 6,250 tons of rubbish a day. It does not have enough trucks to collect all the rubbish, let alone enough space to put it. For 17 years the Jakarta administration has used a 108 hectare tract of land in the neighboring municipality of Bekasi as a dump. Jakarta had what it thought was a water-tight deal. So when the Bekasi administration decided to raise the 'rent' on the land, all hell let loose.

The new agreement signed by the Jakarta and Bekasi administration gave Bekasi management responsibility for the dump. But confusion reigned over the interpretation of the contract. The Bekasi administration claimed that it owned the land, and had the right to manage it, but Jakarta wanted to keep control of its biggest dump.

Under the Regional Autonomy Act (23/1999), the mayor of Bekasi has to meet his municipal budget deficit. For him the dump is a potential pot of gold. He imposed a levy of Rp85,000 (A\$14) per ton of rubbish dumped. In addition, he calculated that Bekasi could make money out of recycling, making organic fertiliser, and converting the gas produced by rubbish into electricity.

Instagram chief Adam Mosseri on Friday said that a test of hiding "likes" at the image and photo sharing social network will spread to the US.

"Heads up! We've been testing making likes private on Instagram in a number of countries this year," Mosseri said in a tweet.

"We're expanding those tests to include a small portion of people in the US next week."

Facebook in September confirmed it is dabbling with no longer making a public display of how many "likes" are racked up by posts.

Such a change could ease pressure to win approval with images, videos or comments and, instead, get people to simply focus on what is in the posts.

The Borneo Orangutan survival (BOS) foundation has created a new habitat for orangutans in Salad Nusa Island, Central Kalimantan Province. The foundation aims to preserve the habitat of orangutans on the island.

The island was chosen due its deal on orangutan habitat. It has well-preserved vegetation throughout the year. BOS foundation claims that 10% of the orangutan population need to be rehabilitated, due various reasons, such as the high risk of disease, physical handicaps and a lack of skills to survive in the wild, caused by prolonged captivity. The problems can be overcome by creating a special habitat, which is not accessible to wild orangutans.

Denny Kurniawan, Nyaru Menteng Program Manager, stated that the plan got the attention of the local people and government. The local people have agreed to accept compensation paid for the land and plantations, which will be transformed into the new orangutan habitat.
