5 minutes		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Asking the students to read and to observe texts about procedural texts (recipe and manual).</li> <li>• Asking the students to find out: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The structure of the text.</li> <li>- The purpose of the text.</li> <li>- The function of the text.</li> <li>- The type of the texts.</li> <li>- The difference between text 1 and text 2.</li> </ul> </li> <li>(giving a minute for students to find the answers)</li> <li>• Discussing the answers with the students.</li> </ul>
10 minutes		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dividing students into 4 groups.</li> <li>• Giving each group two texts of food/drink/how to make something.</li> <li>• Asking students to discuss on their group (Edmodo, in small groups)</li> </ul>
Closing minutes	10	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• After discussion session, all the students back to Google meeting.</li> <li>• Each group give their presentation about their result of discussion.</li> <li>• Giving conclusion and summarizing all groups discussion.</li> </ul>
15 minutes		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Asking students to do quiz on google Classroom (Using google form).</li> <li>• Giving appreciation to all groups' work.</li> <li>• Giving reflection by asking the students questions: What have you learned today? What do you like the most from this material? What haven't you understood about the material?</li> </ul>

## Cognitive Assessment

### How to upload a video to YouTube

1. Log in to your YouTube account.
2. Click on the video icon at the top right hand side of the window, which can be found next to your user icon, messages, apps, and notifications.
3. Click 'Upload Video.'
4. Then, press 'select files to upload' to find the video file saved on your computer. Or, you can drag and drop it into the window.
5. An optional step is to choose the privacy settings on your video (but more on that below). If you choose to stop after this, you will technically have achieved what this article is all about. Namely, your video will now be on YouTube. That said, it will be lacking a proper description and tags, which are crucial if you want your content to be found by the community of viewers. Also, if you don't change the name of your video, it will automatically be rocking the same file name as when you uploaded it from your computer. To avoid that (and to properly finalize the process), you'll need to fill out the following sections:
6. Add an SEO friendly title so that it's more easily discoverable via search engines.
7. Add a description of the video so people know what your content is about before watching it.

8. Add tags, which act as tools to help the discovery of your video.
